

#### Uniform

It has been great to see children return to school looking so smart in their uniform. We will be reminding children of the uniform expectations this term as we will be monitoring it more closely after Christmas.

The only earrings that are acceptable are plain studs, one pair please. Make-up is not allowed. Hair must be tied back if long, to help minimise the spread of head lice. We do not approve of shaved designs or hair colouring, in line with rules in secondary schools.

The school uniform consists of the following items:- Navy sweatshirt White polo shirt Navy, black or grey trousers/shorts, skirts/pinafores/skirts Pale blue striped or checked summer dresses Sensible black shoes.

All children from Reception to Year 6 are expected to have a P.E. kit. This consists of:- Green Polo Shirt Shorts Daps (preferably slip-on).

We would be grateful for your support in maintaining standards as we believe it helps children prepare for secondary school where the consequences for not wearing the correct uniform can be missing free time.

Consistency of uniform will also reduce competition between children (brands etc.) and support the DFEs recent focus on reducing uniform costs for parents. Supermarket brands are a great way to reduce costs, we do not insist of uniform including our school logo.

We expect all children to be wearing the correct uniform after Christmas and you will be contacted if our policy is not being followed.
