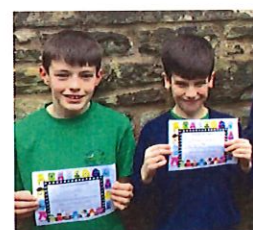


Well done to Florrie who has achieved her swimming certificates recently.
