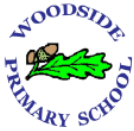

This is really positive feedback from our children. As ever, we will look into the 'no' responses and address them. In the meantime, please reiterate our messages about friendliness. We tend to say, 'If you can't say anything nice then please don't say anything' just to help children to have some thinking time before they comment.
