There is enough space for two tickets per family for the evening performances and yours are attached to this newsletter. The hall will not hold more than two adults per family due to fire regulations. Please ensure you have your ticket when you arrive to avoid disappointment. To enable these evening performances, please bring your child to the hall (in costume) between 5pm and 5:15pm. EYFS and KSI will need their costumes in school on Tuesday please.

The morning and afternoon performances will still go ahead in the school hall using the one ticket per family that we have already issued. To avoid disappointment please ensure you have your ticket when you arrive as we have allocated them fairly and according to capacity.
