We do not offer drop-in meetings before school except in exceptional circumstances.

Shoes

Please make sure your child has sensible flat shoes for running around at playtimes. Some girls are starting to wear heels, which is not safe or appropriate for a busy school day. Thank you for your co-operation.

Please discourage boys from wearing shorts in very cold weather. Girls should also be appropriately dressed for the weather, wearing warm tights or trousers.

Uniform, jewellery and hair

Please refer to the below, from our Parent Handbook on our website.

<u>Jewellery and Hair</u> The only earrings that are acceptable are plain studs. During P.E. sessions earrings and watches must be removed for safety reasons and given to the class teacher for safe-keeping. Hair must be tied back if long, to help minimise the spread of head lice. As in all schools, we have incidences of head lice and when we are made aware, letters are sent to all parents in a class to let you know with advice on how best to treat it. We do not approve of shaved designs or hair colouring, in line with rules in secondary schools.

Communication Slip

Rarely, children miss a playtime for poor behaviour. Parents sometimes ask us if they can be informed about this so they can support at home, so a communications slip will be sent home.

Reception and Year Six height and weight checks will take place on 23rd April 2020.

Illness: If your child needs prescribed medicine in school time, please label it and complete the medicine form (from school office). We have emergency Calpol but do not administer that unless it is an emergency and we have been able to contact a parent.

Gaming at home-raising awareness

Teachers have supported some very upset children recently as there have been issues with online gaming at home.

We have also been made aware of some KS1 children playing or watching Grand Theft Auto, which is really concerning. If you have any concerns please contact us.
