

Safer Internet Day

Tuesday 7th February was safer internet day. At Woodside, children are taught ways to be safe online through computing and PSHE lessons throughout the year. As parents and carers you play a key role in keeping your child safe online. There are many games and online sites that the children talk about but please make sure they are age appropriate for your child.

You can check out reviews on commonsensemedia.org as these will help guide you as to whether or not the app or game is suitable. As a guide, Roblox and Fortnite are suggested for children age 13+ and really should not be being played by children of primary school age.

Studies have shown that some of these games can lead to children missing out on sleep, developing anxieties through inappropriate things they have seen or heard online, feeling as though they are missing out and not being able to socialise easily.


