

If you are bullied:

DO:

- · Ask them to STOP if you can.
- Use eye contact and tell them to go away.
- Walk away.
- Use the worry box if you are too scared to speak openly about it.
- · Talk to a friend.
- Tell a trusted adult —
 Speak out and stay safe!



DON'T:

- Do what they say.
- Retaliate
- Get angry or look upset.
- · Hit them.
- Think it's your fault.
- Hide it.

What should I do if I see someone being bullied?

- Get involved by telling an adult straight away.
- Don't confront the person who is bullying— you might end up getting hurt or you could end up in trouble yourself.
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening—call for help

The Head, Governors and Staff will work together to:

- Make our school a place where everyone can feel safe and happy.
 That means no bullying allowed.
- We will help everyone to get on with each other and we believe that everyone has the right to be who they are.
- Make sure everyone has less worries to carry around

What will happen to a bully? Teachers will get involved and help solve problems. They can talk to your parents and talk to your friends.

What is Bullying?

A bully is someone who hurts someone else by using behaviour which is meant to hurt, frighten or upset another person. This behaviour is repeated frequently.



Emotional: hurting people's feelings, leaving you out.

Physical: punching, kicking, spitting hitting, pushing.

Verbal: being teased, name calling. Cyber: saying unkind things by text, email and online.

Racist: calling you names because of the colour of your skin or your cultural differences
