English

Reading: Aim to read every day! Read books you have at home, even the tricky ones can be shared with someone at home. Read online books using www.booktrust.org.uk or www.oxfordowl.co.uk or www.freechildrenstories.com and www.twinkle.co.uk has some

great stories as power-points with comprehension questions to go with them which are great – just select the year group and get going!

Spelling: Work on the common exception words for Year 1 & 2.

Writing: Aiming to write a sentence a day would be great. Remind your child to include a finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. Year 2 children don't forget the other punctuation you have learned (comma's, exclamation marks, question marks and speech marks) and also those connecting words (because, but, then, also, so, and) You could keep a diary, write a recount of something you've done, write stories or make an information booklet. www.robinhoodmat.co.uk has lots of writing ideas to help you at home. Science:

Ideas for you to do:

- Build a bug hotel and monitor what bugs you see – can you identify the bugs, which bugs are the most and least common?
- Grow your own fruit and vegetables – can you grow things from seed, what do they need to grow successfully?

- Can you identify plants in your garden, take photos, draw pictures of them and use the internet or books to identify what they are.
- Plant sunflower seeds, watch them grow and re-plant them seeing how high they grow during the Summer.
- Think about what your garden needs to stay looking good – can you help look after your garden?

Time to get creative!

- Dress up and do a show for your family, maybe get them to record it and send it to some of your friends!
- Collect twigs and other things from the garden and make pictures on the ground or use string to tie twigs together to make things.
- Use old bit of fabric and wool to do some weaving using twigs and string tied together
- Set a treasure hunt for your family in your garden or somewhere you go for a walk.
