
Hello Fallow Deer,

### Writing:

Next week will start our Indian Spice topic but this week I want you to think about the time you have had over Christmas and do the following activities:

- 1. Make a list of all the gifts you received.
- 2. Write some thank-you letters or cards to send.
- 3. Write a recount of what you did at Christmas.
- 4. Think of your favourite gift and write a description of it.



We're starting a topic on Time so here are some activities that will be in line with what we're doing in class.




#### Yr1s

- To order the days of the week from Sunday to Saturday.
- To know and order the months on the year and link these to the seasons.
- To be able to order daily activities, eg. Waking up, having breakfast, going to school, eating lunch, playing, reading a book, going to bed, etc...
- Make an analogue clock face knowing the difference between the hour hand and the minute hand. Tell the time to each hour.



## Yr2s

- To recap telling the time and writing the time to o'clock.
- To tell the time to half past the hour (noticing what happens to the hour and minute hand). It helps children to understand 'past' if they colour a half the clock face that the hand passes through.
- To tell the time to quarter past the hour. Look at the coloured part of the clock to help with 'past' the hour.
- To tell the time to quarter to. Colour the 'to' half of the clock in a different colour and this will help children to learn the difference.
