JOB DESCRIPTION

Name: Teaching Assistant (SEN)

Responsible to: Headteacher

Main Duties and Responsibilities

Duties

This job description describes in general terms the normal duties which the post-holder will be expected to undertake.

Supporting teaching and learning

- 1. Assist in the educational and social development of pupils under the direction and guidance of the head teacher, SENCO and class teachers
- 2. Assist in the implementation of individual programmes for students and help monitor their progress
- 3. Provide support for individual students and groups of students inside and outside the classroom to enable them to fully participate in activities
- 4. Work with other professionals, such as speech therapists and occupational therapists, as necessary
- 5. Assist class teachers with maintaining student records
- 6. Support students with emotional or behavioural problems and help develop their social skills

Administrative duties

- 1. Prepare and present displays of students' work
- 2. Support class teachers in photocopying and other tasks in order to support teaching
- 3. Undertake other duties from time to time as the head teacher requires

Whole school issues

- 1. Support the aims and ethos of the school
- 2. Set a good example in terms of dress, punctuality and attendance
- 3. Attend team and staff meetings when appropriate
- 4. Undertake professional duties that may be reasonably assigned by the head teacher including taking responsibility for the maintenance of resources for allocated subject areas and carrying out break time duties.
- 5. Be proactive in matters relating to health and safety.

SEN TAs are expected to provide support and advice to other TAs; be more independent in preparing/adapting work for children if asked and to work across classes if required.

This job description sets out the main duties of the post. Such duties may vary from time-to-time without changing the general character of the post or the level of the responsibility entailed. Such variations are a common occurrence and cannot of themselves justify a reconsideration of the grading of the post.
