Key Vocabulary	
Capital city	The city or town that functions as the seat of government and centre of a country.
London	The capital city of England.
Landmarks	An object or feature of a landscape or town that is easily seen and recognised from a distance.
Map	A diagram of an area of land or sea showing features, cities, road etc.
Key	A list of symbols that appear on a map.
Route	A way or course taken in getting from a starting point to a destination.
River Thames	The longest river that runs through London and though Southern England.
Bridge	A structure carrying a road, path or railway across river, road or other obstacle.
Cathedral	The principle church where the bishop is officially associated.
Museum	A building in which objects of historical, scientific or cultural interest are stored and exhibited.
Statue	A carved or cast figure of a person or animal.
