

Maths

Yr1: Will look at finding half and quarters of objects and shapes. They will be learning the place value of numbers between 50-100 and in geometry, learn about position and direction.

Teachers: Mrs Oliver & Mrs Bushell

Yr2: Will be measuring lengths and heights and comparing measurements. In statistics, they will be collecting and interpreting data in pictograms and bar graphs. Our geometry topic will be based on position and direction.

Why?

To consider areas of the world that have different climates and the animals that live in them. To deepen our understanding of the world and continue improving our geographical skills and knowledge. To explore some history related to how people travel now and to use maps and atlases.

Geography

We will focus particularly, this term, on the animals that live in hot and cold places. We will continue to look at hot and cold areas/ countries of the world and consider their weather and climate. We will use maps and atlases to help us consider the similarities and differences between countries.

To design, create and evaluate 'nature' sculptures in the style of Andy Goldsworthy. To make animal masks, mould and sculpt clay animals and design, make and evaluate enclosures for their clay animals.
