They will extend to estimating amounts on a number line and adding and subtracting ones up to 20.  Key Instant Recall Fact:  To add 0, 1 or 2 to a number.   Yr2:  Yr2s will begin to add and subtract 2 digits numbers (with no exchanging) and use these to solve problems. They will recap how to make equal groups and learn how repeated addition, e.g. 5+5+5 is the same as 3 groups of 5 and 3X5 as we begin to explore the structure of multiplication. Children will be covering the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and their Rainbow Maths will be based on these once taught.  Key Instant Recall Fact:  I know doubles and halves of numbers to 20. Science We will use scientific skills to further explore materials through carrying out a number of investigations into their properties and suitability for various purposes. Geography We will explore different homes in the local area with a local survey. We will briefly consider the similarities and differences between rural and town/ city living.
