RSPB Big Schools Birdwatch 2024

Well done to the children in Woodpecker class who braved the winds to complete their birdwatch this week. Children spotted lots of different birds including woodpigeons, coal tits and robins. The big Garden Birdwatch is the UK's biggest citizen science wildlife survey. By taking part, we are helping the RSPB and other scientists understand how our garden birds are doing right now. We added our results to the national records. Thank you to those of you who brought in binoculars to help with our spotting!









Young People's Book Prize Children in Woodpecker Class have been chosen to be part of the judging panels for the Royal Society and their Young People's Book Prize. The children have been busy creating persuasive posters and talks to encourage the other KS2 children that their book is the best. On Thursday they shared all their ideas with children from Red Squirrel class and we held a vote—3 of the books were tied on 16 points each.
