#### September in EYFS/Key Stage 1

For September, we are renaming our EYFS/KS1 provision and children will all be in 'The Orchard' rather than in 'Dormice' or 'Fallow Deer' class.

Your child will register with the class teacher assigned to them and have their peg, tray, morning routine and will be taught their year group curriculum either in year groups or small groups with different teachers and adults in 'The Orchard.' We already use this approach and do this well at Woodside (please see last OFSTED report).

In previous years the mixed- class approach has caused some anxiety and parents have brought to our attention that their child may feel left out if they were placed in one class or another. 'The Orchard' will allow children to feel that they are part of one community and as children will be taught in a mixture of year groups or small groups throughout the day, they will not miss out on seeing friends.

We thought we would communicate this new structure early and will provide further information throughout the summer term.

#### Severn Trent Water visit

The whole school were able to take part in a special assembly on Monday. Mr Jansen came in to talk to us about the water cycle and how we can help to save water. We heard how we use 1% of the earth's water in our everyday lives. And found out more about the different parts of the water cycle. We learnt that precipitation is a word we can use to describe different kinds of weather, like sleet, hail, snow and rain.



We are already very good at using reusable water bottles for our drinks but we also learnt about turning the tap off when we clean our teeth so it isn't left running, having a bath but only filling it half way and having 4 minute showers. Classes in Key Stage 2 completed

workshops and guizzes to help them learn even more.
