

Free School Meals

For every child that is entitled to free school meals the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply—even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal. All you need is your national insurance number and an email address. You can find out more from the following internet link:

You need to apply before March 31st so your child will continue to receive meals. If you are eligible for Free School Meals you may also be able to benefit from the Holiday Activity and Food Programme, allowances to support buying school uniform or food vouchers. It is definitely worth finding out more.



Assessment weeks

Some children may have mentioned NFER tests at home this week. These are the assessments we use to see how well the children are learning and if there are areas that we, as teachers, need to cover again. We usually try to complete these over a 2 week period so your child may begin these next week. The results also help staff with their teacher assessments that you receive on the end of term report in March. Please ask your child about the tests so you have some idea of what it is they are being asked to do. KS2 Sats week is in May:
