#### Internet Safety

We are finding that a number of our children are watching YouTube videos that aren't really age appropriate and are playing games such as Fornite. Fortnite is rated T for Teen by the ESRB, which means it's suitable for teens and older due to violence. In Europe, it has a PEGI rating of 12, suitable for ages 12 and up due to infrequent mild violence. Please make sure that you are aware of what your child is playing and watching online. Some of our younger children in Key Stage 1 are aware of these videos and have been sharing their content which has made a few children a bit anxious. We do have an information and support session coming up in June (Cyber Safety for Parents) which may be useful if this is something your child is showing an interest in.


#### 2.3 Key stage 2 test timetable for 2025
