

Attendance

The Department for Education introduced updated statutory guidance on school attendance in August 2024, known as "Working Together to Improve School Attendance", to address the growing concern over declining attendance rates across the UK. The guidance aims to reduce term-time holidays, unauthorised absences, and offer support to families whose children are struggling to attend school. The key points from the guidance as follows:

Support First

The guidance stresses a "Support First" approach, encouraging schools, parents, and other agencies to collaborate to understand and address the reasons behind a child's absence. Schools are expected to offer early support to families to prevent further absences. Parents are encouraged to reach out to the school if attendance becomes a concern.

Formalizing and Intensifying Support

If informal support does not improve attendance, or if it is not engaged with, the school will work with partners, including the local authority (Gloucestershire County Council), to formalize the support.

Measures may include:

Notice to Improve: Issued if a child has 10 or more sessions of unauthorised absence within 10 school weeks. This can include unauthorised absences, being late after the register closes, or taking term-time holidays.

The notice will outline expectations for attendance improvement. If not met, a Penalty Notice may be issued.

Notice to Improve

A Notice to Improve will be sent if a child accumulates 10 or more unauthorised absences in 10 weeks. Absences can span across different terms, academic years, or schools. The notice will specify the expectations and time frame for improvement. If expectations are not met, the school can request a Penalty Notice.

Penalty Notice

Penalty notices can be issued if a Notice to Improve is ineffective or for holiday-related absences that exceed 10 sessions within 10 weeks. Penalty fines are set at £160 (reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days). For a second penalty notice within three years, the fine is £160 with no reduction. Penalties apply to all adults with responsibility for the child (including step-parents), and fines are issued per child.

Holiday Absences

Schools are prohibited from approving term-time holidays unless there are genuinely exceptional circumstances. Penalties may be issued if a child misses 10 sessions in 10 weeks, even if part of that is due to a holiday.

Consequences of Unpaid Fines

If a penalty notice is not paid within the specified time frame, the case may be taken to court by the local authority.

Purpose:

The overarching aim of the guidance is to ensure that children do not miss out on their education, as absences can significantly impact their learning and development.
