What influence does believing in God as Trinity have on Christian worldviews? RED SQUIRREL CLASS

In general, Christians are monotheists, believing in one God.

Christian tradition understands God in terms of the Trinity; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The nature of the Trinity and its persons are set out in the Apostles' Creed.

The Trinity: The Father

- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ God the Father is seen as the creator of the world.
- · He is loving, powerful, and caring.
- The Father represents God's authority and protection.

The Trinity: The Son (Jesus)

- Christians believe Jesus is the Son of God and God in human form.
- ${f \cdot}$ He lived a perfect life, taught people about love and forgiveness,

and performed miracles


The Trinity: The Holy Spirit

- The Holy Spirit is believed to guide, comfort, and inspire Christians.
- Described as God's presence in the world today.
- · Associated with symbols like a dove, wind, or fire.

What is a belief?

- A belief is an idea accepted as true by an individual or group.
- Beliefs can be religious (e.g. belief in God) or nonreligious (e.g. belief in equality).
- · Religious beliefs often guide how people live their lives
