Attendance Top Tips

My child has a short term illness. Do they have to go to school, and will I be penalised if they don't?

If your child is ill, read the NHS's Is my child too ill for school? - NHS advice to help you decide whether they can go to school. If they are too ill to attend, you are not breaking the law and will not be penalised. You should let the school know as soon as possible on the first day of absence and schools must record such absences as authorised. If the absence due to illness is ongoing or frequent you should speak to your child's school to see what support can be put in place.



Rights Respecting

Children have weekly Rights Respecting assemblies.

Remembrance Day

Article 38- Children have the right to be protected during war. Article 22- Children who are refugees, should get help, protection and the same rights.
