Royal Society's Young People's Book Prize

We're really fortunate to be selected once again to be part of the judging panel for this award. We're looking forward to receiving a copy of the shortlisted books to share in class and then with the whole school. This year's six books cover a world of rocks, the life of prehistoric animals and the secret inner workings of a tree.

Panels of young judges, drawn from hundreds of schools, science centres, and community groups from across the UK, will read the shortlisted books and declare their champion. The 2025 winner will be announced at an award ceremony in April 2026.

For over 35 years, the prize has celebrated the very best science books aimed at readers under 14, helping to spark curiosity and a lifelong interest in science. Past judges have included broadcaster Gabby Logan and beloved children's author Michael Rosen. In 2024, over 4500 books were distributed to schools as part of the judging process, supporting access to high-quality science writing in classrooms and libraries across the country.

Attendance Top Tips

How can I help my child enjoy school and attend regularly? Be organised, have a plan, be consistent and involve your child! You

- ensure they have an appropriate bedtime routine
