

Children's Mental Health Week 2026

This year's Children's Mental Health Week theme - This Is My Place - focuses on helping children feel they belong: in their home, at school, in their community and within themselves. Here are some simple, practical ways families can build belonging every day.

Family Belonging Board: Create a board (whiteboard, corkboard or fridge door) where everyone adds photos, drawings or notes about people and places that make them feel they belong.

Family Playlist: Make a playlist of songs that make everyone feel happy or connected. Play it during meals or drives.

Our Family Daily Check In: Create a quick family ritual where everyone shares: - One High (something good) - One Help (something they need support with) This helps children feel heard and supported.

"You & Me" Time Tokens: Make tokens that children can redeem for special time together, e.g. 10 minutes of playing a game, reading together, cooking together, drawing together. Children feel connected when they know they have your uninterrupted attention.

Belonging Walk: On a walk, ask: "What's one thing you like about this place?", "Where do you feel safe or happy here?" "Who does this place remind you of?"

Our Places Photo Hunt: Take turns photographing: something that feels like home, something welcoming, something beautiful, something that makes you smile.

World Book Day

World book day is on Thursday 5th March. To celebrate this year, children are welcome to come to school dressed as their favourite book character or in their pyjamas, as we will be enjoying a hot chocolate and story.

We will also be running a book swap similar to previous years. Please wrap a book up at home and write 3 clues on the front of the paper e.g. The Gruffalo- preschool/ EYFS book, animals, forest . Children will be able to bring these books into their classes and swap as a mystery book. They will then keep the book that they have chosen from the swap. Please can we ask that books are age appropriate for the class your child is in.

Children will be completing other book themed activities during the school day and we are really looking forward to it!

OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Operation Encompass is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and all police forces.

“ Children who live in homes where there is domestic abuse, or who experience domestic abuse in their own teenage relationships, can be negatively impacted by this experience. ”

“ We have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained about Operation Encompass procedures. This allows us to use the information that has been confidentially shared with us by the police, to understand how a child may be impacted by domestic abuse and to then offer support to the child/ren in our care. ”

“ This information means that we can understand a child’s behaviour and support that child in whatever way they may need or want. ”

“ Operation Encompass means that our school will be told, prior to the start of the next school day, when police have attended an incident of domestic abuse where there is a child or young person who attends our school who is related to any of those involved in the incident. ”

“ We are keen to offer the very best support possible to all our pupils and we believe that being part of Operation Encompass helps us to do this. ”
